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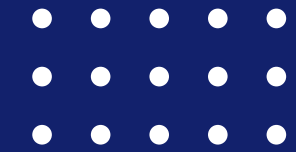
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LHI OVERVIEW

Let's Help International (LHI)-Uganda is a Refugee led-organization in Kyaka II Refugee Settlement promoting education, protection, and digital inclusion.

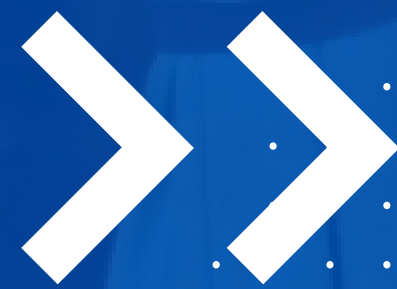
Despite limited resources, LHI continues to create impact through volunteerism and strong community engagement. In 2025, the organization improved access to learning, safety, and digital skills for vulnerable populations. This report presents key achievements, challenges, and future plans.





KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 65 students supported to access and remain in school.
- 300 children supported with meals during Christmas celebrations.
- 19 PSN shelters constructed and renovated for vulnerable households on behalf of UNHCR through Alight Partnership.
- 36 individuals trained in basic ICT skills (12F, 24M including 6 community leaders).
- Community outreach reaching over 3,000 people.

Despite growing evidence of the positive outcomes of young women's economic empowerment, young women continue to experience unequal access to education and skills development and face barriers to securing decent employment and opportunities to thrive as entrepreneurs.

Chance MUNYERENKANA is a volunteer at Let's Help International –LHI providing support in helping women increase their bargaining power, confidence, and give them choices to act on their own, and their families' behalf with respect to safety. She has relevant experience in empowering women through skills and workforce development. She holds Bachelor's Degree in Agronomy with focus in Food Science.

OUR SOLUTION

To increase access to decent employment and entrepreneurial opportunities, LHI has provided vocational training to young, out-of-school women, single mothers and elderly women including practical skills which are ready to sell on market instantly from the time when they are acquired.

We also provided training in computer skills, and tailoring to youth, (girls and boys) and young women both in Kyaka II refugee Settlement –Uganda, and South Africa.

LHI team conducting vocation training sessions that enable women to learn entrepreneurial skills from which they create their own initiatives and generate more supplemental income for their families.

PROGRAMME UPDATES

Working with a variety of partners, our programmes promote women's ability to secure decent jobs, accumulate assets, and influence institutions and public policies determining growth and development. One critical area of focus involves advocacy to measure women's unpaid care work, and to take actions so women and men can more readily combine it with paid employment.

B. INFORMAL EDUCATION



CHALLENGES FACED

- Limited funding and lack of a permanent office space continue to constrain program expansion and operational efficiency.
- Insufficient training equipment and resources compared to the high demand for services.
- Limited income-generating opportunities for parents of beneficiaries, affecting their ability to sustain children's education and improve household livelihoods.
- Difficulty sustaining programs due to heavy reliance on volunteer-based operations.



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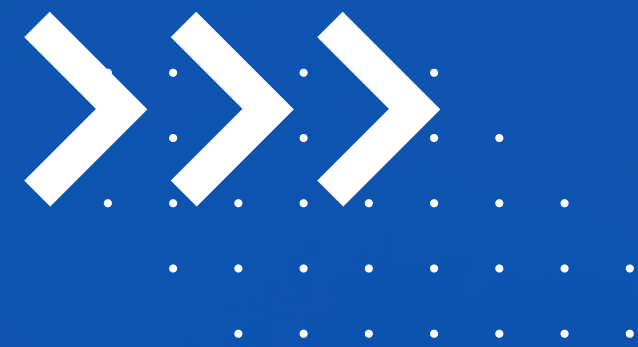
FUTURE PLANS



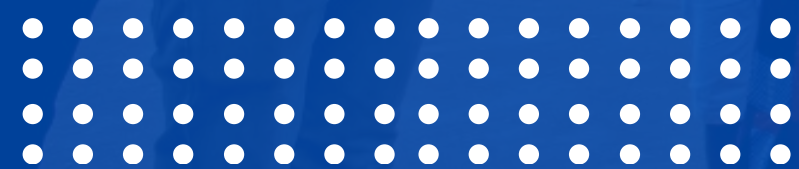
Let's Help International

- Expand support to 100+ vulnerable children through community fundraising, partnerships, and advocacy.
- Strengthen household resilience by supporting parents with income-generating activities such as small business capital and equipment.
- Partner with FCA to enhance teachers' capacity in digital skills (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, online tools, and AI for research).
- Establish a train-the-trainer model to grow community-based ICT educators in Kyaka II.
- Integrate digital literacy across education and protection programs for holistic empowerment.
- Set up a Community Learning Corner with reading and digital resources to promote self-learning.
- Strengthen collaboration with schools, OPM, and UNHCR partners to improve inclusion and student retention.

In 2025, Let's Help International (LHI) remained committed to improving the lives of refugees and host communities in Kyaka II through education, protection, and digital inclusion. Despite limited resources and operational challenges, the organization continued to make a positive impact by supporting vulnerable groups and promoting digital skills.
